

RENEWABLE ENERGIES

Being aware that the increased destruction of natural resources is endangering the economic, social, and cultural basis on which human life depends,

Recognizing the need to increase the percent of global energy derived from renewable energy,

Understanding that each region is unique, it is important to take into consideration the characteristics specific to that region and tailoring and promoting renewable energy technologies to respective needs,

Recalling the 1997 Kyoto Protocol and the two World Earth Summits on Sustainable Development in 1992 and 2002,

Fully endorsing the outcome of the world summit on Sustainable Development, considering it a good basis for future international cooperation and intend to go beyond the agreement reached in the area of renewable energy,

The Commission on Sustainable Development,

1. Requests the Commission of Sustainable Development work toward specific national targets with the ultimate goal of increasing the global use of renewable energy and the reduction of harmful emissions;
2. Urges member states who have ratified the 1997 Kyoto Protocol to continue upholding its standards and to further assist those who have not signed or ratified to adopt this protocol without delay;
3. Committing ourselves to cooperate in the further development and promotion of renewable energy resources;
4. Recommends the establishment of a multinational conference to facilitate cooperation between developed and developing nations;
5. Suggests funding for this implementation will be accessed from the UNDP, NGOs and bring together businesses and organizations that are committees to acceleration and deployment of renewable energy and energy efficiency systems.
