

Canadian International Model United Nations Conference
Summit on Indigenous Peoples
Resolution 1.1

Noting with concern the apparent lack of adherence to the Universal Declaration of Human Rights with respect to indigenous peoples,

Cognizant of the human rights needs of indigenous peoples. These rights include:

- a) basic human rights
- b) domestic self-determination
- c) sustainable development

Stressing the need for a framework to better meet these needs,

Reminding the international community that each situation is case-specific and should be handled on an individual basis,

1. Recommends that the governments critically analyze their current legislation to better guarantee the rights of indigenous peoples;
2. Reminds the international community that the parent country's constitution is the ultimate authority in matters of domestic issues;
3. Acknowledging the distinct nature of indigenous peoples;
4. Encourages indigenous people to send a representative to engage in dialogue with existing state government.
