Resolution 1.1

*The Summit of the G20,*

*Recognizing* Iraq's right to territorial sovereignty, per the International Covenant of Economic, Social, and Cultural Rights,

*Encouraging* the continuing democratization of the sovereign Iraqi state in respect of the people's cultural and religious beliefs involved in government decisions,

*Applauding* the Paris Club's recent initiative to reduce Iraqi foreign debt owed to them by 80%,

*Recognizing* the need to ameliorate human security through multilateral efforts to further stabilize the Iraqi nation,

*Bearing in mind* that the Iraqi government must play a direct role in alleviating local instability,

*Emphasizing* the complex societal structure and ethnic composition of Iraq,

1. *Urges* all creditor states of Iraq to follow the lead of the Paris Club in reducing Iraqi foreign debt;
2. *Recommends* the continuation of donor conferences which increase the funding of Iraqi structures and programs with the hosting of the next conference in Tokyo 2006, with Iraq as the chair;
3. *Notes* with approval the establishment of the Trade Bank of Iraq, an Iraqi-staffed institution, which facilitates imports and exports and encourages and facilitates trade and foreign investment;
4. *Recognizes* the United States' lifting of commercial trade sanctions on Iraq and a necessary step in reintegrating the country into the international community and marketplace;
5. *Expresses* the hope that more nations will follow the United States' lead in the lifting of sanctions and embargoes against Iraq;
6. *Urges* all nations to locate and return all Iraqi assets transferred there by the former Iraqi regime to be put to use for the further rebuilding of Iraq;
7. *Calls upon* all G20 members to allocate 0.005% of their GDP to Iraq reconstruction, with one third due every year, conglomerated at the 2006 Tokyo conference;

8. *Urges* all interested, UN-approved, advisory and monitoring non-governmental organizations to apply for monies from this fund and these applications will be considered and approved by the G20 at the Tokyo Conference in 2006;
9. *Encourages* each G20 nation to allocate funds either to the Iraqi government directly, and/or to non-governmental organizations dedicated to reconstruction efforts in Iraq.
