The Reconstruction of Iraq

The Summit of the G20,

Recalling Resolutions 1483 and 1546 concerning the use of the international community in the reconstruction of Iraq,

Bearing in mind Resolution 1546, which reaffirms the rights of the Iraqi people and the freedom to self-determination and control over their political future and natural resources,

Encouraging the Iraqi people to aid the in stabilization of Iraq,

Underlining the importance of multilateral assistance from UN member states in the stabilization of the Middle East,

Emphasizing the authority of the Security Council in the maintenance of peace in Iraq,

Resolves that the UN should play a vital role in humanitarian relief, the reconstruction of Iraq, and the restoration and establishment of national and local institutions for representative governance,

Stressing the integral importance of the principles of the United Nations Charter (Article 13, Chapters 9-10),

1. *Calls upon* the G20 to finance an international fund to assist in the subsidy of education, health, and primary infrastructure (i.e. roads, water, sanitation, police, etc.) which would be conditional upon the financial viability of each member state;
2. *Encourages* the creations of an Iraqi Finance Fund (IFF) for development, transformation, and commercialization of Iraqi Oil Industry in order to encourage economic prosperity of the newly formed Iraqi Government, which would be:
 - a) Chaired by Iraq (giving them final say);
 - b) Monitored by financial advisors from the UN and other international monetary institutions;
3. *Encourages* the reconstruction of Iraq through the promotion of direct foreign investment by members of the G20;
4. *Urges* an 80% reduction of the total Iraqi debt.
