

Canadian International Model United Nations Conference
First Committee: Disarmament and International Security
Resolution 1.2

The General Assembly,

Noting destabilizing effects of regional conflicts and arms races,

Recognizing the right of all States to protect their sovereignty and their right to self defence in accordance with article 51 of the United Nations Charter,

Noting that human security would act as a catalyst for social and economic development in former conflict zones;

1. *Urges* member states to place greater emphasis on the reintegration of ex-combatants into civil society in order to encourage peace building and thus, heightened human security;
2. *Calls upon* the international community to join the Ottawa Convention of 1997 on antipersonnel landmines and to take concrete measures to eradicate mines within their national territory;
3. *Supports* the submission a report on the issue of rehabilitation of injured combatants and civilians to the WHO for further consideration;
4. *Urges* transparency throughout the undertaking of the aforementioned actions.
