## **FOLLOW UP ON THE AGENDA FOR CHANGE**

The General Assembly,

Bearing in Mind the Report of the High-level Panel on Threats, Challenges and Change, “A More Secure world: *Our shared Responsibility*” which states that “the challenge for any reform is to increase both the effectiveness and the credibility of the Security Council,”

Considering the Report of the Open-ended Working Group on the Question of Equitable Representation on and Increase in the Membership of the Security Council and Other Matters Related to the Security Council A/57/47 which shows that there are multiple plans for reform but none with a commanding consensus,

Determined to “intensify our efforts to achieve a comprehensive reform of the Security Council in all its aspects” A/55/2 as stated by the United Nations Millennium Declaration adopted by the Heads of State and Government,

Noting that “Summit Meetings provided a unique forum for exchanging views and strengthening cooperation. [the Secretary-General] recommends that the Heads of State and Government meet in alternate years, just before the general debate commences in the General Assembly” A/47/277 *An Agenda for Peace, Preventive diplomacy and peace-keeping*,

Aware of Chapter XVIII Article 108 of the UN Charter which states that any changes to the UN Charter “shall come into force...when they have been ratified by 2/3 of the Members of the United Nations, including all the permanent members of the Security Council,

1. Requests that a Heads of State and Government Summit be planned to follow up on the work of this Special Session;

2. Accepts Japan's pledge and support to host the Summit in Kyoto in the Fall of 2005 before the General Assembly convenes;
3. Calls upon the Secretary General to provide his Good Office in the planning and execution of the Summit.
