Draft Resolution: 1.7

Sponsor: Australia, Argentina, Antigua and Barbuda, United States, France  
Signatories: Pakistan, Mexico, Russia, France, Saint Vincent and Grenadines, Trinidad and Tobago, Iran, Saint Lucia, Norway, Italy, and Niger

Mindful that the much laudable goals of security council reform are the promotion of democracy in decision making, transparency in conduct, more equitable geographical representation and increasing legitimacy,

Fully aware that some members of the General Assembly do not see that inclusion of new permanent members as a desirable or effective in the quest for a council that is more efficient,

Underlining the 2020 year that was brought up in the High level panel report as a realizable timeframe for Security Council reform,

Acknowledging the differences of views and interests related to Security Council composition,

- 1.) Urge a review of the Security council by the General Assembly every 10 years;
- 2.) Recommend the Permanent Members of the Security Council concede the veto when voting on Council appointments.
